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P1 and P2 Afterschool Club

Year 1-2 after-school club commenced Monday 19th April for Year 1 and 2 to accommodate parents/guardians who have to call at 2.15 p.m. and again at 3.05 p.m. to collect older children. This club is for Year 1-2 children who have brothers or sisters in Year 3-7. The club will be in the child's classroom and will run from 2.00 – 2:50 p.m. daily. The children **must** be collected punctually by an adult from the club at the classroom collection point (P1C Mrs Crampsey's, P1A Miss McIntyre's and P1B Mrs McColgan's door)(P2A and P2B from the side door at the canteen). Please adhere to social distancing guidance and safety measures when collecting your child. The cost of the after-school club is £5.00 per week (or £1 per day). This money will be used to provide a snack etc for the children. Payment to be made via ParentPay. Please contact the office if you have any issues accessing the ParentPay App. If you wish to avail of this club, please sign application form sent out via school app and submit your application. Due to high demand, places will be allocated in the order of receipt of completed applications.

Sustrans

Steelstown Ps & Nursery Unit has been awarded the Sustrans Bronze Medal Award, Thank you to Miss Lynch and the Eco Committee for all the effort put in so far.

- Cough
- Temperature

A close contact is:

A person who has been close to a confirmed case from 2 days before the person was symptomatic to 10 days after the onset of symptoms and:

- Lives in the same household
- has travelled in a car with the case OR
- has been within 2 metres of a case for more than 15 minutes OR
- has been within 1 metre of a case and had face-to-face contact including:
 - being coughed on
 - having a face-to-face conversation
 - having skin-to-skin physical contact

If you have been identified as a 'close contact' via 'HSCtracing' text or through the StopCOVID app

? What does this mean? Go home → Stay home

Can I go to the shops?	No ✗
Can I go to work or school?	No ✗
Can I go out for a walk or exercise?	No ✗
Can I meet up with friends outside?	No ✗
Can I go into my garden?	Yes ✓
Can I visit my friends or family?	No ✗

Does this mean I will definitely get COVID-19? No but you are at risk - a 'close contact' is a person who has been close to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19.

How long do I need to stay at home? 10 days As a close contact you need to self-isolate at home because you are at risk of developing symptoms in the next 10 days and could spread the virus to others before the symptoms begin.

If you develop symptoms book a test.
